The following update is provided to the Mayor and Council for review and consideration.

#### Garden Lane Update:

The project is fully underway and anticipated to be complete around the first week of school. The contractor is very hopeful that there won't be any delays in completing the project before the beginning of the school year. If you are able to drive by the project, you'll see the road has been mostly laid out and much of the rock has been placed. Still to do is the sidewalk ramps, concrete sidewalks, asphalt sidewalks, compaction and asphalting of the road.

Speaking with some of the folks who live on or near Garden Lane are all very happy with the results of the project and are excited to see the finished product.

#### Governor's commitment of planning dollars for Water and Sewer Projects.

As many read in the paper this week and heard from the Governor last week, there is potential for planning dollars for communities to apply to the state for water and sewer projects through the Idaho Department of Water Quality (IDEQ). No additional information has been released from IDEQ about the process for these planning dollars, but we are hopeful that once there is more information, we may be eligible for use of funds towards some of our capital planning in both departments. Staff will report back to Council once more information is available.

#### **Comprehensive Plan RFQ**

The RFQ deadline is today, August 13<sup>th</sup>. Depending on the response from the proposal, staff will be reaching out to a team of people to go through the selection process in the coming weeks. The following timeline is projected for the selection process.

- 1. Evaluate applications the week of August 23, 2021
- 2. Interview finalists (if conducted) the week of September 20, 2021
- 3. Designation of the most highly qualified firm to City Council on or before October 5, 2021.

The City's Electric department has installed 11 poles along Highway 95 for ITD's Phase 2 project. The next step in the project is to pull the wire onto each pole on the new route. The City does not have adequate equipment to complete this work, so a quote was solicited from Palouse Power to complete the line pull.

Attached is the quote from Palouse Power to complete the work required to compete the proposed project. A more detailed description of the work is located in the attached contract.

I recommend that Council approve the quote and proposed contract for the power line pull for a total of \$34,720.00. A few months ago I requested that Council allow staff to spend up to \$100,000 to complete the total work for the line relocation. I estimate that the City has spent about \$25,000 to date to complete work to this point, so the total amount after this contract would be approximately \$60,000.

#### INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR AGREEMENT

AGREEMENT made between the City of Bonners Ferry, a political subdivision of the state of Idaho, herein "ENTITY" and Palouse Power., herein "CONTRACTOR",

THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. **CONTRACT:** ENTITY hereby employs CONTRACTOR as an independent contractor to complete and perform the following project: provide all equipment, labor, and materials as described in the attached quote to install electrical conductor, including the following work on 11 of the City's new power poles:

• Mobilization/demobilization, install travelers for neutral, cover all hot crossings, set-up wire pulling equipment and staging, pull in sock line, pull in 3-336 conductor and neutral, sag installed conductor, dead-end and clip all phases, remover travelers, equipment, and uncover all hot crossings.

#### 2. TIME OF PERFORMANCE AND TERMINATION: Parties agree that:

CONTRACTOR shall complete the project by September 30, 2021.

3. **COMPENSATION:** ENTITY agrees to pay CONTRACTOR as compensation a total not to exceed \$34,720.00

4. **INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR:** The parties agree that CONTRACTOR is the independent contractor of ENTITY and in no way an employee or agent of ENTITY and is not entitled to workers compensation or any benefit of employment with the ENTITY. ENTITY shall have no control over the performance of this Agreement by CONTRACTOR or its employees, except to specify the time and place of performance, and the results to be achieved. 6. **INDEMNIFICATION:** CONTRACTOR agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless ENTITY, and its officers, agents and employees, from and against any and all claims, losses, actions, or judgments for damages or injury to persons or property arising out of or in connection with the acts and/or any performances or activities of CONTRACTOR, CONTRACTOR'S agents, employees, or representative under this agreement.

7. **INSURANCE:** CONTRACTOR agrees to obtain and keep in force during its acts under this agreement a comprehensive general liability insurance policy in the minimum amount of \$1,000,000 which shall name and protect CONTRACTOR, all CONTRACTOR'S employees, ENTITY and its officers, agents and employees, from and against any and all claims, losses, actions, and judgments for damages or injury to persons or property arising out of or in connection with the CONTRACTOR'S acts. CONTRACTOR shall provide proof of liability coverage as set forth above to ENTITY prior to commencing its performance as herein provided, and require insurer to notify ENTITY ten (10) days prior to cancellation of said policy.

8. **WORKER'S COMPENSATION:** CONTRACTOR shall maintain in full force and effect worker's compensation for CONTRACTOR and any agents, employees, and staff that the CONTRACTOR may employ, and provide proof to ENTITY of such coverage or that such worker's compensation insurance is not required under the circumstances.

9. **COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS:** CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with all federal, state, city, and local laws, rules and regulations.

The City is moving forward with moving electrical infrastructure for Boundary County's Riverside project. City staff has discussed the cost of the relocation with the Boundary County staff and Federal Lands. There has been much discussion regarding the reimbursement of the City's work, which hinges on legal opinions with respect to our easements of the existing power lines.

If the City's work is determined to be reimbursable, a match amount of 7.34% is required. I estimate that the City will spend approximately \$500,000, which would mean a match amount of \$36,700 would be required.

I am requesting that Council approve an amount up to \$36,700 to be used as match for the Riverside Road project for City electric relocation, that would be given to Boundary County when required by Federal Lands.

One item has been added to the project to help collect water from a ditch line adjacent to the church. This addition to the project required a new concrete catch basin and 84 feet of storm drain installation. The total cost of the addition is \$7,548.00.

The total deductive change order cost to the City is: -\$11,684.00 (\$19,232 - \$7,548). I recommend that Council approve Change Order #1 for the Garden Lane Project. The official Change Order form will be provided to you at the Council meeting and ready for the May's signature if approved.
